

Online Coding Session on Antimicrobial Resistance in Bangladesh, Cambodia, China, Hong Kong, the Philippines, and Singapore

Facilitators: Dr Helena Legido-Wuigley, National University of Singapore **Brief:** The purpose of this one-day training was to share and discuss the data collection experience, early findings and coding process among the multi-country partners. A global code book developed from for this multi-country study platform was discussed in detail in the first half of the session, later each country representatives shared example of findings that are aligned with the global code and then the country specific codes. At the end of the coding session a tentative coding plan was decided where each country will list out major codes covered in their country specific findings. Participants also discussed how to synthesise and present the findings. From Bangladesh study team Dr Nahitun Naher, Dr Bushra Zarin Islam, Samiun B.K Tune joined the session. Representative from partner countries including Hong Kong University, University of the Philippines and also National University of Singapore joined the discussion.
